This may be a shock for you, for we have had the intimacy of live streaming for the last 2 months. Yet this has been the reality of many who have had to bury their loved ones for two months now. This is what you have found in funeral homes, Doctor's surgeries, department stores, Coles and Woolies during the lockdown. This is the new normal for public gatherings.

In many respects this may be too much for some people. Yet this is what we are asked to comply to. There will be a door into the church, hand sanitiser, a check list to check off names and numbers, and then a door to leave at the end of the service. This will be a work in process, and patience will be needed. It will not just be 'rock up' and get in. Names will need to be recorded at the office, so I invite you to put your names down for a Saturday afternoon return.

You must book in with the Office. You will need to **arrive by 4.15pm** to complete the registration.

No other physical mass will occur at this time, as we are easing in very gently. We will continue to live stream for Sunday 9am. If this goes well for a few weeks, then we will consider some other options. I want all parishioners who are happy to stay home to stay home. There is no obligation to go outside what is comfortable for you during this time. Mass will still live stream on a Sunday, and the Saturday mass is aimed at making people who feel comfortable to come along. Hence the earlier time slot. It is still bright. You will not be arriving in darkness and you will still get home in the daylight. Understandably this time 4.30pm is temporary for the ensuring few months.

I would invite the following ministries in the church to contact the office with your availability to cater to this 4.30pm Mass across the ensuring weeks after July 18.

Remember this is not a race. If you are happy to stay home, then stay home. We will have to strictly abide by the 100 rule for some time.

This could be around for a while, so I would also like you to start to ponder what Christmas might be like. Do we simply live stream it? We had 1100 people last year. If we can only have 100 people, how do we do this in an inclusive way? I am just planting the seed, so we can start to have a think about how we make this a celebration. Hopefully we continue to move forward. Yet it does not hurt to start to think about how our parish deals with public gatherings.

I am very happy to see how we can prepare for **STAGE 3**. All bearing well, it will be a great celebration to have physical mass.

Yet also, I have also been very happy to live stream. There has been a wonderful spiritual connection there too. Both will continue to occur.
