During Fr Marty's holiday period (June 12-July 3), he has the following reflections for you to consider in light of the lockdown, which we are slowly coming out of. These responses will cover the next three weeks of the newsletter.

The APRE from Aquinas College, Southport asked the Chaplin to the hospital Fr Stephen, Associate Priest at Southport to answer some questions on behalf of the staff of Aquinas College.

## I thought I would respond with what I think as Parish Priest of Runaway Bay.

1. We have all seen the outbreak of Covid 19 across the world. We have seen the impact this had on the world in a relatively short space of time. How do you see the pandemic and this time as a person, as a priest, <del>as pastor at the hospital,</del> and as a pastor to the community?

Fr Marty: As a person: This has been my motto since lock down:

> "Our greatest business in life is not to see what lies dimly at a distance, vet to do what clearly lies at hand." Thomas Carlyle

Fr Marty: I am a glass half full person and I have always had a strong faith in God and been a person of HOPE. Even in the midst of great trial, I have always seen that hope on the horizon. Many times. Focusing on the now, the routine, the daily grind and finding a way to find meaning in this. In all honesty, we cannot really prepare for the future. We can plan, yet there is a saying about 'best laid plans.' So I have found during lock down, focusing on the now, has helped with the pressure of what the future could be like. It also helps with such things as anxiety and a lack of hope. Domestic tasks, the little ordinary tasks have a great way of grounding a person and bringing a sense of peace. Exercise. Looking forward to small treats. Laughing. I made sure I laughed at least once a day for a few moments. Going to bed knowing I have it way better than places like Europe, America and those countries where there is no data on how this event is affecting them.

As a priest: I have been lucky, for I have had six months with the parish and the school community. This has been great because I am familiar with the parish and the school. Imagine if I had arrived in the parish and then within a week locked down! That would have been very challenging indeed. So, since I know most people, I have been able to respond creatively to the issues of live streaming, newsletters, sending out emails and Facebooking parishioners. Personally, I have felt I have been privileged to be able to celebrate mass during this time, yet I have also hoped parishioners have felt the spiritual grace of communion.

As a person and a priest, I have not used the word 'virus.' Everyone knows we are in a pandemic, so why alarm people more than we have to. So, I have not used any word which associates people into anymore fear than there needs to be. There can be a great anxiousness when you use words which have a negative tone to them. I have thought about this a lot and have simply referred to this, as a lockdown.

## How has the parish and the archdiocese responded to Covid 19?

**Fr Marty:** The parish has generally been supportive, yet only because the parish live streamed and sent out newsletters straight away as the lockdown began. As Fr Morgan Batt would say, 'the sheep need to hear the voice of the shepherd'. I think by keeping the parish in communication with the church, they have felt loved and accepted and safe. I have tried to maintain this with the parish and the school, and I think it has been successful.

Archdiocese: They have organised the jobseeker for each parish. So that's \$1500 to help the parishes survive. That's pretty cool when you think about it.
