Brides, often when I tell them stuff about their wedding, the will say, "Perfect." And yet, we all know, that nothing is completely perfect. FUN FACT FOR SUNDAY 19TH July, 2020



On this day in 1873 William Gosse discovers ULURU. Woven in with the natural fascination of the rock is an overriding 'sense of place' in the Australian desert and a remarkable Tjukurpa (dreaming) and white history. For many people, it seems to me, that they just pass through the land. But when you take time to walk, see, listen, taste and understand allowing the land to pass through vou: new worlds are unearthed: in the land and in your heart. For the traditional inhabitants of the Red Center of Australia, the ANANGU people, their land is everything. Alan Breaden a few years after Gosse, wrote these lines; "Standing out there in the stark desert, its weathered scarred walls rising sheer and bare to a height of 1100 feet, it seems to dwarf the mind by its presence...Yet drop your eyes you cannot...You feel as a little thing and of no account...It looks like some deliberate trick of nature...dropped there to guard and sentinel for ever the great western deserts." (A Tramp-royal in Wild Australia by A.Russell. 1934. Jonathon Cape. London. P.142)
