Translated from the Greek it says: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me." The big letters on the left are abbreviations for 'Mother of God'. And the big letters on the right are abbreviations for 'Jesus Christ'. (Thanks to Fr Tom Duncan from the Toowoomba diocese for translating for me.) I looked at it and went, I am pretty sure it is Greek, but that's about it.

This style of art work is called Iconography. It is ancient.

It goes back over 5000 years dating back to the ancient Greeks. These images are holy presences, they are living and dwelling amongst us. So when we look at an icon it is alive with holy presence. It is like we are looking through a window which opens up the divine to us. What strikes you when you look at this image? The gestures have a specific meaning. They are simple, yet they convey an economy of memes. The back ground is gold, and that is a powerful metaphor for the image of light. Notice the eyes. What are they saying and where are they looking? When we look at an icon, we share in a relationship of presence.
