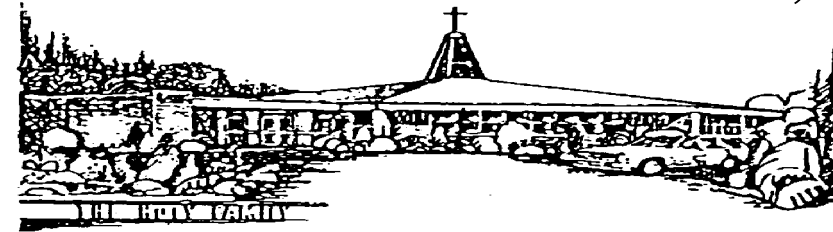

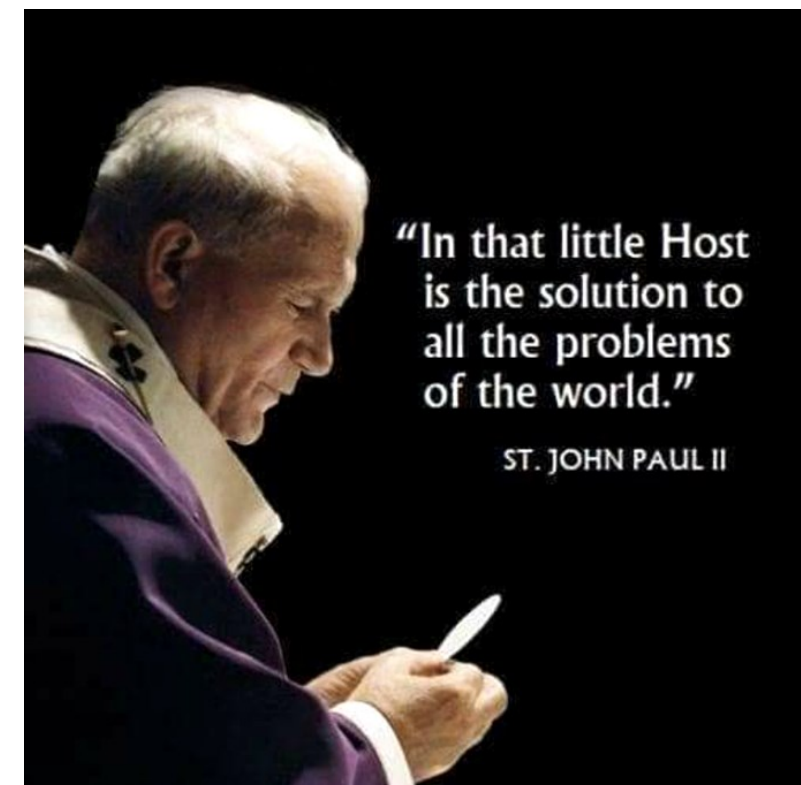
God has a reason for allowing things to happen.

The Gospel this weekend challenges us with our responsibilities. What are we responsible for and who do we account ourselves to? Ultimately, we are responsible to God, yet some people fail to see this. So, the question needs to be asked; why did Jesus tell this story and what can it teach us? Most importantly it tells us something about how God deals with us, his disciples and servants. The parable speaks first of the Master's trust in his servants. While he goes away he leaves them with his money to use as they think best. While there were no strings attached, this was obviously a test to see if the Master's workers would be industrious and reliable in their use of the money entrusted to them. The master rewards those who are industrious and faithful and he punishes those who sit by idly and who do nothing with his money.
