Happy Advent everyone! The start of a new liturgical year!!!! Advent is my favorite time of the year! We embrace the birth of Jesus and then Christmas!

It's wonderful that restrictions are lifting, yet we need to stay vigilant.

We are living with a Covid world and that means we have to abide by certain requirements.

With this in mind, I am asking you for help over Christmas.

We have three masses on Thursday 24th of December in the Quad at St Francis Xavier Primary School. We have two masses on Christmas Day. I am outlining below what we need to make these 5 masses work.

- Arrive early at least 15 minutes.
- Need to complete registration on arrival standard process for Covid-19.
- Social distancing required standard process.
- If street parking is not available, park cars in the school grounds **no parking warden** park the car with room to move (this has been standard in the past).
- One collection only after the homily there will be 4 collectors supporting the process.
- Communion will be managed by an usher starting from the back.

How to live the Gospel out this weekend.

Not only is Advent my favourite time of the year, yet we delve into my favourite Gospel. The Gospel of Mark. So this year we enter into Year B/1. Short, sharp and to the point. As my uncle always use to say, if after 5 minutes of talking, stop boring!

Mark was written roughly around 60-70CE, just after the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem. The Romans were persecuting the Christians, so this Gospel does not have the time to deal with florid descriptions and antidotal thought. The writers of Mark wanted to write quickly and get down the main points. Hence when we go into ordinary time, it starts so starkly. "Just after John the Baptist was arrested..." Mark's Gospel is straight down to business.

So, what are the main points as we enter into this year of readings with Mark? With the characters in Mark's Gospel, it is not what they 'do' in relation to Jesus- it is how. **How do they 'do' in relation to Jesus**. In other words, what is their speech, their actions and their manner when Jesus speaks or acts.

The over-arching theme for Mark's Gospel is God. God who is good-verses evil and Satan, who is bad. In every story, that theme is present.

In some senses, for Mark's community of writers and hearers, this is the cosmic conflict of good verses evil. It's the Kingdom of God verses the Kingdom of evil. And the writers reveal the mystery of God through Jesus.

The final thing is this. The disciples, though chosen, are flawed individuals according to Mark. They have been selected by Jesus to hear God's word, yet they question, they fail and they do not understand. This is a marvelous point to consider. Yet, for the 'Marken' community, the disciples continue to follow Jesus, despite the fact that they are flawed. And that is encouraging for us.

We too, who question and doubt and are flawed, are invited into the same Gospel that was written in persecution, yet emanates a love and a witness to God, that God wants the world to hear.
