### How to live the Gospel out this weekend.

I have spoken to you how Mark's Gospel is short sharp and to the point. Yet the interesting thing is that as the Lectionary was produced for Year B/1, they had to borrow from other Gospel writers to get the 52 weeks of the year completed. So we hear from John's Gospel today, because Mark has already said all this last week. This is a timely reminder to think about whether we can be concise or do we need to repeat ourselves giving the same message over and over again.

Laurie Woods (2020) helps us to connect to the Gospel today. "The gospel reading today is not from Mark but from John who identifies the opposition that rose up against John the Immerser, whose public message was embarrassing the religious leaders and exposing their hypocrisy, and so they needed to try and discredit him. They asked him why he was performing the ritual washing if he wasn't the messiah or Elijah come back. His answer was to say that his washing with water was only a prelude to the action of the coming messiah who would wash or immerse people in the Spirit, so that they would become Spirit people and their lives would be guided by the values of the Spirit.

Laurie Woods who is one of my sources, often has a joke at the end of his reflections. I call them Dad jokes, because they are embarrassing funny. I do not tell jokes, as I don't remember them and don't really find jokes overly funny. However, this did catch my eye in terms of the internal change that goes on within us during the Advent season.

A Zen master was walking through a city park one afternoon contemplating the beauties of nature when he spotted a hamburger stand. He went over and said to the hamburger vendor. 'Please make me a hamburger with the works.' So, the vendor makes up a super hamburger and hands it to the Zen master, who pays with a \$20 note. The hamburger man puts the note in his cash drawer and closes the drawer.

'Where's my change?' asks the Zen master.

The hamburger vendor replies, 'Change must come from within.'
