"Times are a changing and we are moving forward."

During Covid-19 times we have had to adapt to tough and challenging new ways of providing religious services to the Holy Family Parish parishioners. Since our early restrictions started in 2020, we have created a new mass time schedule to support parishioners (live streaming, 2 Saturday masses and 2 Sunday masses); and this has worked well.

However, it is now 2021 and many of the physical challenges of the previous year have become second nature, such as - social distancing, registering for mass and hand sanitising. It is now the first quarter of 2021 and it is now time to move back to a more ordinary mass schedule - similar to a PRE COVID mass time environment. We have had two masses on a Saturday for many months. It is time to return to a more manageable mass schedule of ONE SATURDAY MASS.

After careful consideration it is planned that in the near future the 4.30 pm and the 5.30 pm Saturday masses will be merged. A NEW TIME SLOT WILL BE CREATED – it will be 5.00 pm Saturday.

The new mass schedule will commence on PALM SUNDAY 2021. That is on SATURDAY 27 March 2021. Palm Sunday eve (SATURDAY) will be at 5.00 pm.

As is the norm, REGISTRATION is still required for all masses. Please ensure that you contact Audrey at the Holy Family Parish office for mass registration. If you have any question concerning the planned change, please contact the office.

Pius IX saw John's dreams as a legacy for those John worked with and as an inspiration for those he ministered to.
