

How to live the Gospel out this weekend.





We have the good shepherd reading this weekend and it has always been a favourite of mine. This picture is from my first week as a priest and I had to do confession with 32 kids at Stella Maris in Maroochydore. I had done one confession previously, so I was a little out of my depth. We would use the good shepherd reading as a way of helping the kids to understand forgiveness. I was pretty nervous. I had been ordained two weeks earlier. I had one weeks' holiday and then straight into ministry. So it was all happening! What was funny though was Fr Joe Duffy, who was the parish priest hadn't introduced me to the kids or parents, so they all thought I was just an altar boy. I had my alb on, but did not wear a stole when I came out to the front of the church. I put my stole on and the look from the parents in particular was a lasting memory. They had never seen a young priest before. So their initial reaction was priceless when I put my stole on. The way their jaws dropped and their eyes expanded was a memory I won't forget!

So, time has passed and I am glad to say I am happy to be here at Holy Family Catholic Parish. In one sense I can understand the good shepherd story more fully. "I know my own and my own know me." After being in big parishes where it was hard to get to know people, I can at least say I know all of you by face. That is a big blessing in my ministry. So, I just wanted to say thank you for welcoming me into Holy Family, yet also to get to know you all a little more closely. It is only since being here that I can finally understand these words: "I know my own and my own know me."
