#### HOLY FAMILY PARISH NO MORE SECOND COLLECTION CONTRIBUTION ENVELOPES

Changes include the requirement to use the Queensland Government QR code application (pasted on all church entrance doors), socially distancing and sanitising our hand before entering the church.

Additionally, the parish had to change its method of weekly second collection contribution. The Brisbane Archdiocese has moved toward the use of bank deposit and direct debit for the second collection.

Holy Family Parish will no longer distribute 2021/2022 second collection contribution envelopes to Holy Family parishioners who are part of the Holy Family Planned Giving campaign.

The weekly second collection will still exist at weekend masses and second collection contributions can be placed in the collection net passed around by volunteer collectors.

For all Holy Family parishioners (and visitors to Holy Family Parish) if you have a mobile phone (with internet access) please download the QLD QR Code application and use it to check-in prior to mass.

Our weekly mass registration records show that some parishioners, with mobile phones and internet access, are not using the QLD QR code to check-in to the church.

It is important that you use the Queensland Government application to check-in to the Holy Family church for all masses you attend.

### How to live the Gospel out this weekend



In one sentence Mark gives us an insight into the compassionate nature of Jesus. He could see the crowd was thirsting for the wisdom he had to offer, and he felt for them because they looked lost, wandering leaderless like sheep without a shepherd. His response was to speak to them with words of guidance and reassurance. Mark says he 'taught' them, but we know this was not so much 'teaching' as providing words of support and an explanation of his way to God, of what it takes to follow a lifestyle that enriches a person's relationship with God, others, self and the world around.

What Jesus had to say was exactly what the people were craving, because they had heard him speak and flocked back to hear more. He was making sense and doing it with authenticity and genuine passion. Everything he said was relevant to their lives and he offered hope to those who were so downhearted they did not dare to hope. People were saying he spoke with authority not like the religious leaders of the day who did not practise what they taught (Mark 1:22). Strange how immature and self-serving leadership quickly degenerates into hypocrisy and injustice.

Today's gospel presents Jesus as a great example of maturity and authenticity. He is not concerned about his image or the opinions of others but operates with its own well-formed truth based on personal wholeness, inner tranquillity and a solid relationship with God, others and creation in general.
