

they know that the words of Jesus, however strange, are utterly true and trustworthy. Therefore, they stay with him and follow him wherever he leads.

The Annual Catholic Campaign is all about listening to the words of Jesus, "the Holy One of God", trusting what we hear and following where he leads – becoming more and more like the Master as we go, until we become so like him that people see Jesus in us. It is to be blessed and to become a blessing in turn.

I ask you today to support the Annual Catholic Campaign in this strange landscape through which we are passing where we're all feeling the pinch in one way or another. The Campaign is one way of focusing on what really matters, which in the end means focusing on Jesus and listening to the strange and wonderful words he speaks – not just hearing but listening. His are "the words of eternal life", the words of him who says, "Come you blessed of my Father: inherit the Kingdom prepared for you (Matt 25:34), for...as long as you did this to one of these, the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me" (Matt 25:40). We focus on the least in order to focus on Jesus and follow him - because "to whom else can we go?" He is the only one who can lead us home.

Productive dialogue always begins with openness

Both interpreted him literally and the writer points out the danger of reading Jesus literally. Neither character actually listened to him with their heart. They could not see the spiritual message beyond the words because their right brain was turned off. A narrow approach to Scripture might see these writings as a set of instructions for moral behaviour. In fact, Scripture is an inspired art form designed not to inform but to transform.

All of the above speaks of openness. What does it take for me to be open to the Spirit? When we hear or read a piece of Scripture we need to dialogue with it bearing in mind that transformation is not a one-way process. Productive dialogue always begins with openness, which then can lead to awakening. Sunlight is a disinfectant. great (Laurie Woods, 2021)
