### How to live the Gospel out this weekend.

(Laurie Woods, 2021). Here is another exchange between Jesus and the Pharisees. Some Pharisees and scribes (lawyers) took issue with those disciples of Jesus who failed to wash their hands before eating. This was in breach of one of the traditions of clean and unclean that the Pharisees in particular paid great attention to. Codes of kosher food and ritual cleanness were taken to an almost fanatical degree by the Pharisees. Mark adds his editorial comment here to inform his largely non- Jewish community of these codes and Jewish practices.

In response, Jesus fired a salvo calling his critics hypocrites for placing merely human traditions above the commandments of God – basically for deceiving themselves with mixed-up priorities. Here is another instance where Jesus demonstrates the importance of getting our priorities in the right order. It takes us back to the second reading of James who prioritised action over words. It's easy to talk the talk, but it takes integrity to walk the walk with a spirituality of the heart. I'm reminded of the dictum attributed to Socrates: *The unexamined life is not worth living*.
