

I have been persisting with this thought for the week as it is really important, yet, easy to forget in the moment. Even the smallest blessing must be acknowledged. Otherwise we simply do not celebrate what God has given to us. Now more than ever we need to thank God for small miracles and blessings.



Reflection on the Gospel



Two major points merge from this Gospel account. The first is the irony that while Bartimaeus has lost his physical sight, he has the spiritual sight to understand who Jesus is and this gives him deep trust. Secondly, knowing who Jesus is and having established a personal relationship with him, he simply must follow him. He cannot not follow him. When we have found the ultimate treasure we cannot leave it alone.

Mark starkly contrasts Bartimaeus' response to Jesus with that of James and John in the previous story, where their chief desire was to sit at either side of Jesus in his kingdom. They totally misunderstood the goal of discipleship and set their bar pretty low. Compared to Bartimaeus their performance was a poor show.

I can imagine Jesus after his Spirit experience with John in the Jordan being driven by the Spirt into a guiet deserted place to sort out his goals and priorities – to ask himself what he most desired. The options were to nip off back to Nazareth and play safe in anonymity, or to lash out along the path of the prophets and risk criticism and rejection. I believe the Spirit spoke through his gut feeling, and through prayer and discernment he came to a clear realisation of what he had to do to become the person he was meant to be.

What steps do I have to take to answer the question, 'What do I most desire?' Am I on the right path to becoming the person I am meant to be? What needs fixing? (Laurie Woods, 2021)
