### **HELLO! From Fr Marty**

"Our greatest business in life is not to see what lies dimly at a distance, yet to do what clearly lies at hand." Thomas Carlyle



We continue to welcome you back to Church!!! Carry your masks with you.

Just to be clear, you are my highest priority, and not an hour goes by when I am not thinking about your safety when you are in the Church.

We are a small church in terms of building size, so I am always mindful of that. Bigger churches have the luxury of being able to space people out. The current arrangements have been approved as from Easter and we have not changed that since

I know there are a lot of contradictions with all of this, and it is always on my mind when I see people not doing the right thing. Yet this is what I have been following for the last 6 months.

Just to be clear, at all times, you must carry your mask with you. Mine is always in my pocket. If you are sick, you must wear a mask, and you need to go to your local GP.

This is the directive from QLD health and from the Arch-diocese.

You must wear a face mask at all times when you are indoors, including workplaces when you are unable to stay 1.5 metres away from people who are not from your household unless:

- you are seated
- you are at your residence

- · you are eating or drinking
- you are a patron inside a hospitality venue such as a café or restaurant
- · you are inside a sports stadium
- it is unsafe to wear a mask

There are some other exceptions to wearing face masks, including for children under 12 (unless they are in high school) and people with particular medical conditions or disabilities. If in doubt, wear a face mask.

### Advice regarding mass services;

- \* masks should be worn while entering and leaving the Place of Worship
- \* if seated, masks are <u>not</u> required to be worn even if less than 1.5m apart
- \* Priest (and Eucharistic Ministers) should wear masks while distributing communion (as they would be standing and less than 1.5m apart)

I will go back to wearing a mask at Communion. As this is sensible. I have already decided, if I get sick, I will wear a mask.

### Change in COVID Mask Requirements for Choir/Cantors

In line with current government restrictions, the Archdiocese will ease some of the current mask requirements for choirs and cantors. Please note that effective immediately, the cantor(s) and choir members may remove their masks to sing as long as they can maintain at least 1.5 metres physical distance.

## Clergy vaccination status from Bishop Ken

Last week I wrote to all clergy reminding them that it is the Archbishop's expectation that all clergy in the Archdiocese of Brisbane be vaccinated against COVID-19 unless they have an official medical exemption. Clergy and archdiocesan employees have been asked to record their COVID-19 vaccinations in an online archdiocesan database. It is strongly recommended that the parish advise parishioners via the parish newsletter and/or website of the vaccination status of the clergy at that parish. We are receiving enquiries from vulnerable parishioners wanting reassurance that the clergy have been vaccinated against COVID-19.
