We continue to welcome you back to church!!!



We are into Advent 2, and this generally means we start to ponder what it means to welcome Christ into the world. What does that mean for you?

The Advent theme of preparing for the coming of the Lord clearly shines through today's readings. It gives us the feeling of hope and anticipation for what is about to happen.

Advent is a time for us to reflect on our hospitality, our readiness to receive others into our life with generosity and without judgement.

As you know, hopefully December 17 will mean we can catch up with our loved ones. Yet, as you know, this is never a sure thing. Also too, the business of getting ready to visit loved ones brings a rush of its own. There was a famous comedian who once said, we spend all our time waiting to get to the next experience, yet when we get there, then we spend our time waiting to get out of it. It pays to ask the question, what are we really looking for in life?

Those key words today for Advent 2; are readiness, generosity and not to judge. Particularly at this time when pressure is high, we do judge more easily.

I had to go to the shops the other day late on Friday and I was surprised at how rushed people were. People were flying over the speed bumps like they weren't there and people seemed to be tense at Coles and Woolies. This s pretty normal for this time of the year, yet it doesn't mean we cannot at least say- "Hey, slow down." Yet also, we need to think about why people are rushing. We never know the storms people have to get through, just to make it to this moment. This is why it is important not to judge.

This is the time where we need to think about who comes into the world at Christmas. And while we help the kids to appreciate the gift of giving through Santa, we also need them to appreciate who Jesus is. And they do get it, but it takes that opportunity to slow down to think about it. With Christmas decorations being put up in October, no wonder kids can be confused, let alone adults. Now more than ever, we need to just take deep breaths and just think about what is really important in this moment.

Slow down, be patient and wait for the Lord. There is too much rush at Christmas time. Slow down and wait.

Scripture in today's mass

We really focus on the first reading. Today's reading is beautiful. Laurie Woods (2021) helps to break it down for us today. I thought it might be a useful reading in terms of being patient, not to judge and to be mindful of this time of the year.

Baruch 5:1-9 This extract has been attributed by Hebrew editors to Baruch, who was secretary and companion to the prophet Jeremiah. The setting is the Babylonian exile of the Jewish population of Jerusalem. There is no evidence that Baruch was ever in Babylon, so, the setting is most probably a literary fiction created to provide a background for the encouraging tone of this reading.

These verses could be described as a poem of consolation, rich in metaphor, in which the writer encourages Jerusalem to look forward to the restoration of her children after their years of exile. The poet conjures up the picture of Jerusalem shrugging off her cloak of sorrow that enveloped her children when they wept by the waters of Babylon, as they remembered their homeland and lamented their exile. They will shortly experience God's goodness and compassion that will spread over them like a cloak of integrity and peace.

Jerusalem is about to see the hills and mountains flattened and the valleys made level so that her people may walk in safety back to their mother country. Forests and trees will provide shade and calming fragrance for the returning travellers who will have God's compassion and reliable goodness for guidance.

This is a message of encouragement that points to the silver linings in life. One reality that most of us have discovered is that every silver lining has to be sought after. Better times that follow dark times do not just drop from the sky, we have to work for them with energy and optimism. We have to seek help; look for that person whose eyes and body language and perhaps words say, 'Lean on me.' It is for certain that the Spirit works through the Christ in those we can turn to for support - just as the Spirit works through us when we provide a spiritual and psychological buttress for others.
