# 3rd Sunday of Advent Year A/1 The Presence of God in Today's World

Fr. Daniel Berrigan S.J. spends hours in a hospice for the terminally ill, sitting quietly at the bedside of a young boy who is totally incapacitated. The boy cannot speak, hear, move, or respond in any apparent way to those around him. He lies there totally helpless and dependent on others for his very survival.

People would look upon this powerless boy as a burden to society and to himself and would choose to put closure on his life. But while sitting there attentive to the silent powerlessness of this young boy, Fr. Berrigan experiences the presence of God, a God who has chosen to be dependent on us for survival in our world today. "What you have done to these, the least of my brethren, you have done to me." (Mt 25:40)

As we prepare to celebrate God's presence in this world at Christmas, let us be somewhat surprised at the way God chooses to make his divine presence known to us.

When John sent a messenger to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" Jesus spoke not of strength or power, but of healing compassion. He said, "The blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, and the dead are raised."

For some, Jesus' presence among the powerless, the helpless and the dependant would be a stumbling block. They were expecting a Messiah who would sit in judgment on those who had sinned and reward the righteous with wealth and power. There were those who looked upon the circumstances of the poor and the disabled as God's condemnation of sin.

But Jesus' way is the way of respect, compassion and openness to the need we have for one another. He challenges John the Baptist and us to have faith in his way of relating to one another not by domination and power and conquest, but by our acceptance and compassionate presence.

Like Fr. Daniel Berrigan, let us take time to sit quietly in the presence of God in our world. Perhaps God will reveal his presence to us in the needs of the poor, the demands of the helpless, and the persistence of the dependent. Let today's liturgy disturb us and encourage us to discover an invitation from God in our relationships with one another during this week to rejoice in God's presence in our world.

### To Live in God's Presence

The first step of the spiritual life lies in recognizing the presence of God in all things, in every person. St Benedict defines the high point of our spiritual development as kindness of speech and serenity of soul. Humility requires that we treat all people with respect. The way we deal with others measures our real holiness.

The spiritual life is more than the development of a pious relationship with God, which is more designed to make us feel good than to make us holy. The measure of the spiritual life and its meaning depend on the way we relate to one another. Other people teach us that no one has the right to take up all the space in life. There are other ideas, other ways of doing things, other needs and desires than ours in life.

We must learn to be a peaceful presence in the world so that the world can really be a more peaceful place because of us. We have to learn to stop banging doors and to quit getting hysterical every time the schedule changes. We have to quit strutting and complaining, agitating and fomenting trouble. Where we walk, other people must be safe. When we come into a room, every stomach should not tighten in fear for their reputation or their self-esteem or their peace of mind.

A gentle presence brings everyone to a sense of the sacred in life.
