Everyone should move in an orderly fashion to the FIRE ASSEMBLY AREA outside the Church carpark and along Simbai Street.

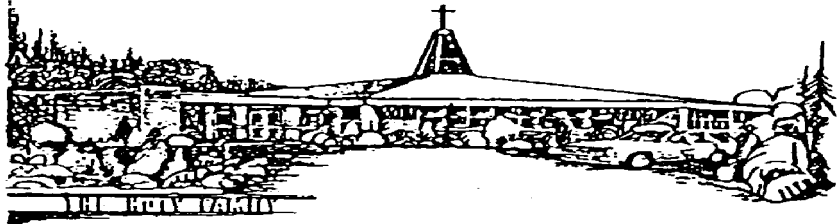

Wisdom Connection

John the Baptist is called to be the voice crying out in the wilderness to make straight the path of Jesus the Messiah. The importance of his role in salvation history, of which the Gospel writer reminds us, cannot be stressed enough. As a prophet, a truth sayers, John testifies to the light that is Jesus. “As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world” (John 9:5), says our Lord. The fact that John can see this awesome light says much about his character. We are the Baptist’s heirs. Each of us must be a voice crying out in the wildernesses of our world, in the places seemingly devoid of God. Each of us must make straight the paths that lead to the hearts of those around us. If we do our part, we make it easier for Jesus to touch, and thereby change, the lives of others.

The world still needs prophets like John the Baptist. Let’s take a look around. Who are the prophets of today in our Church, in our world, in our family? During this season of Advent, let us pray for more prophets, let us pray that we live out the responsibilities of our Baptism by becoming prophets who not only speak the truth but actively listen to it as well.

GOSPEL Jn 1:6-8,19-28 There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God.

His name was John.

He came as a witness,

as a witness to speak for the light,

so that everyone might believe through him.

He was not the light,

only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness:

Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you unknown to you the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
