FOURTH SUNDAY IN ADVENT 24 December 2023 Year B

On this last Sunday before Christmas, the gospel (Luke 1:26-38) clearly announces the coming birth of the one who would be called "Son of the Most High" and "Son of God", who is the offspring of David, who is to rule the House of Jacob. In a sense we have travelled backwards through Advent, having begun with the end of the public ministry of Jesus and the warning of the end-time judgment when he comes again, thence to John the Baptist as Jesus arrives on the public scene, and now to his coming at birth. The selection of readings weaves a context in which to understand who he is when he comes: he is the descendant of King David, who was not right to build a dwelling for the ark of the covenant but whose offspring would build a house for God's name (mentioned in 2 Sam 7:13, but omitted from today's reading). Of course, in its own context this was a reference to Solomon who would build the temple in Jerusalem, but we cannot help but recall the disputes in the temple and the statement of Christ that after they destroy this temple he would raise a new one in three days. But the other connection is that while David could not build a house for God's honour, God would raise the House of David-the focus changes from a building to a family. The new temple Christ was to build is not in a place, for nowhere can contain the presence of God, but it is an eternal body composed of the people of faith incorporated into him. This, then, reminds us that the mystery of the Incarnation refers not only to the birth on earth of one called the Son of God, born to one nation, but to the rebirth of people of all nations into a new divine body. This i the mystery in the second reading (Rom 16:25-27) that is being made manifest to all nations (rendered in our Lectionary as "broadcast to pagans everywhere").

Returning to today's gospel, the connection to the first reading is clear: Mary is betrothed to one of the House of David, and her son is to be called "God Saves" (Jesus), who will be called "Son of the Most High" and "Son of God", and who will receive the throne of David. Here we see the ancient Christian approach to the Scriptures by which they are read and understood as referring more to Christ than to any historical event. The four Gospels especially do this as they weave such passages and allusions together in their telling of the story of Christ. Thus today's gospel has other links to the first reading. The first is quite direct: on entering Gabriel uses the phrase "The Lord is with you", identical to that of Nathan to David in the Septuagint. Then in something of a reversal, while Nathan tells David to "do all that is in your mind" but later overturns this, in the gospel Mary consents "let what you have said be done", and it is done. The reference to Gabriel is interesting in another way, for it reflects Judges 6:12 where the angel says to Gideon, "The Lord be/is with you [identical in the Septuagint to the gospel's greeting], warrior of might". It was Gideon who was called "warrior of might", in Hebrew gibbowr hehayil which became contracted to Gabriel (Gabriy'el), but his story foretells trouble: for after God saved the people of Israel by the hand of Gideon, after his death they did not remember his kindness but returned to their old ways. Luke's account of the annunciation indicates the completing intervention by God on behalf of his people, the one that fulfils the promise to David; Jesus is the one who does what David could not do, the mighty one who dispels not the Midianites (who took Joseph captive to slavery in Egypt) but the great enemies of sin and death; yet not withstanding this mighty work, the House of Israel would forsake him after his death.

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LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING 2 Sam 7:1-5,8-12,14,16 The kingdom of David will be established for ever in the sight of the Lord.

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. I will provide a place for my people Israel; I will plant them there and they shall dwell in that place and never be disturbed again; nor shall the wicked continue to oppress them as they did, in the days when I appointed judges over my people Israel; I will give them rest from all their enemies. The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. And when your days are ended and you are laid to rest with your ancestors, I will preserve the offspring of your body after you and make his sovereignty secure. I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me and your throne be established for ever."

RESPONSORIAL R. For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

I will sing for ever of your love, O Lord; through all ages my mouth will proclaim your truth. Of this I am sure, that your love lasts for ever, that your truth is firmly established as the heavens. R.

'I have made a covenant with my chosen one; I have sworn to David my servant: I will establish your dynasty for ever and set up your throne through all ages.' R.

He will say to me: 'You are my father, my God, the rock who saves me.' I will keep my love for him always; for him my covenant shall endure. R.

SECOND READING Rom 16:25-27 The mystery kept secret for endless ages is now revealed.

Glory to him who is able to give you the strength to live according to the Good News I preach, and in which I proclaim Jesus Christ, the revelation of a mystery kept secret for endless ages, but now so clear that it must be broadcast to pagans everywhere to bring them to the obedience of faith. This is only what scripture has predicted, and it is all part of the way the eternal God wants things to be. He alone is wisdom; give glory therefore to him through Jesus Christ for ever and ever. Amen.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the servant of the Lord: may his will for me be done. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Lk 1:26-38 You will conceive and bear a son.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary 'let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.
